# HISTORY HAPPENINGS

As our re-dedication approaches, here is some history of the dedication 50 years ago. **From the Record-Eagle Newspaper;** "... Michigan Riding and Hiking Trail was officially in being today after snipping of the ceremonial ribbon" by a white horse-mounted Gov. George Romney." "Campsites are being developed and work is moving ahead on a network of tie-in trails covering much of northern lower Michigan. It has been emphasized that the attractions is for both riders and hikers."

We also celebrate the first shore-to-shore ride 50 years ago, from Empire to Tawas, here is some history, again from news articles: Riding into Tawas - "... a big crowd was on hand to greet the riders when they arrived at Tawas City, through which they paraded and where they were guests at a roast beef dinner & were blessed by an Indian Chief." President Fitch Williams told the press, "...that the trail calls for stamina, fords of the Manistee and AuSable rivers... the AuSable is about 150 yards wide and up to four feet deep at the crossing place."

## SECRETARIAL NOTES...

1. Don't forget to bring muck buckets and/or wheelbarrows to Elk Hill to be able to dispose of horse manure in the bunkers provided. Special notice to all 1<sup>st</sup> June Ride participants!!!!
2. Don't forget to get your Recreation Passports for your vehicle license plates so that you can be "legal" on our rides. Rumor has it that the DNR will be checking those tabs more closely this year. 3. The Michigan Shore-to-Shore Riding and Hiking Trail has been "created" on the **www.everytrail.com** website. Come on down and check us out. You'll find the trail and the "rig routes" listed with key words MTRA and Shore-to-Shore Trail. The trail sections that are finished have pictures. You do not need to have an account to access these files. Thanks again to all of our "gps"ers!!!! This is a **work in progress** so please be patient with us.
4. The Shore-to-Shore Trail is also listed on **www.opentrail.us** which is a new website designed specifically for horseback riders. You can find us in the Michigan section.
5. Plan to bring your horses to the Work Bees to enjoy the trails around the camps. We can't work ALL the time!!
6. Just to clarify – after you register and pay for a ride, you can **cancel** 24 hours prior to the beginning of the ride to receive a "cancellation check". In order to receive a **refund** after the ride has begun, you must make a formal request to the Board of Directors which will be addressed at their next regularly scheduled meeting. Questions??? – call the MTRA Office!!
7. The 2014 Trail Rides are filling fast. Please check out the Ride Calendars and the Ride Registration form which are posted on the [www.mtra.org](http://www.mtra.org) website under 2014 Trail Rides. You can register online or print out a form and send it in. If you need a copy in the mail, please give us a call and we'll get it right out to you.
8. Since the potluck dinners were such a roaring success on all the trophy rides in 2013, Joe Burrill has graciously volunteered to again sponsor the potluck dinners on Arrival Days prior to the first day's ride on all 2014 trophy rides. Don't forget to bring a dish to pass and your own table service and drink. There is also the possibility of a lunch wagon for the Trail Rides this year. Jan Wolfin is working hard to make arrangements. Thanks, Joe and Jan!!!! More information to follow...
9. The Board of Directors has approved the option to earn one ride day per one Work Bee day to become policy. This policy originated in 2011 and will continue inclusive of the past two years. In order to earn "Credit" for days worked, you must sign-in at a **regularly scheduled MTRA Work Bee** and work all day. Call the MTRA Office if you have questions.
10. Included with this newsletter is the list of **Trail Assignments for 2014**. This list includes all of the Board of Directors with their trail and camp responsibilities as well as their phone numbers and email addresses. They will all be working hard to clear and mark trails before the rides begin. If you have time and opportunity, please contact them to volunteer some time and effort for the trails we all love.
11. Also included with this newsletter is the list of **Emergency Phone Numbers** in case your folks at home need to contact you when you are on a ride and the cell phones aren't working. The police agencies are listed with phone numbers organized by trail camp. Please leave this list at home so your loved ones can find you "on the trail" or in camp. The Trail Boss emergency phone number will be posted at the rides.
12. If you would like to receive the "approved" minutes from the Board of Director Meetings, please contact the MTRA Office and they will be sent "free" via email to any members' email address. If you would like them via US mail, please submit \$5.00 to cover printing and mailing costs for the year.
13. Don't forget those **Coggins** tests for this summer's rides. Coggins tests are "current" for a full year after the date the blood is drawn and tested so be sure that your Coggins tests are "up to date" before the rides on which you plan to participate. These tests, along with "travel papers" or health certificates are also required of all out-of-state horses. Bring these "papers" with you when you check in with the Trail Boss on the rides.



14. Just a reminder – the MTRA does **NOT** share, sell or in any way distribute email addresses or phone numbers with anyone!! If someone contacts the MTRA office for information about a member, we contact that particular member and have them make contact with the inquirer. Our goal is to protect the privacy of our members!!
15. Special thanks goes out to the vote-counters who helped out with the Board of Director ballots at the recent Annual Banquet.
