BOARD BRIEFS:

1. The MTRA blue bandanas were displayed and will be for sale at all Trail Rides thru the Trail Boss for \$5.00 each. Similar bandanas (different colors) were awarded the first 3 places at the Fun Horse Show on our Re-Dedication day in Kalkaska.
2. Please notice that the August Work Bee has been relocated to Garey Lake Trail Camp. Picket poles and trail work needs to be done. Bring your horses to ride after working. Free lunch will be provided on Saturday, August 23.
3. The Annual Trail Ride calendar committee presented their suggestions for 2015 and with just a bit of tweaking, the rides were approved as corrected. The Calendars will be submitted to the DNR for approval in September. Tentative dates will be announced in the December Newsletter and will be posted on the www.mtra.org website as soon as possible.
4. A new way to honor members and former members of the MTRA was presented by Pat Galloup. It will soon be possible to purchase brass nameplates of those you wish to honor which will then be posted on trail marker posts in the areas where they have helped maintain or worked on the Shore-to-Shore trail. More information to follow as this process gets developed.
5. Al Davis shared the generosity of the 1st June Ride participants with a check for \$538.73 dedicated to the Youth Riders' Fund from the sale of glow sticks and the "Match It" contest.
6. There's a new bus for the MTRA which will be used on the August Family Ride. More information to follow. Yes, it will be blue!!

The Youth Riders' Fund has taken a beating in the past few years but due to the generosity of the MTRA members, we are back up to a balance of almost \$10,000 in the fund. This year has been very successful with the donation of \$1200.00 from the silent auction at the Annual Banquet, \$250.00 from Tractor Supply Company, \$600.00 of donations from glow sticks, returned cans and bottles and the Match-It competition on the 1st June Ride, \$588.00 from the Annual Kim & Steve Ross South Branch Ride, and \$1900.00 from the 2nd June Ride which included glow sticks, cans and bottles returned, the auction and Rent-a-Kid. And there have been many members who donated to the Youth Riders' Fund when they renewed their 2014 memberships as well as several members who donated the funds from their returned cans and bottles. Special thanks goes out to all of the generous folks who have supported the Youth Riders' Fund in the past and especially this year!!!! Those Youth Riders are our future!!!

2014 Ride Statistics – thus far...

The 1st June Riders began their adventure at Mullett Lake on May 29th. With 71 trophy hopefuls on the trail to/from Mackinaw the next morning, the skies were blue and the weather excellent. Only one problem – the Big Blue Bus was ailing! After jumping rigs and riding back to camp in trucks making multiple trips, the ride continued with only a few hiccups. Finally, the bus was “fixed” and 52 trophies were awarded at the end of the ride – Lake Huron at last! 2. **Double Cross – Criss/Cross Trophy**
3. **Trophy Rider**
4. **Full payment of ride/date signed up**
5. **Group Riders**

SECRETARIAL NOTES...

1. For out-of-state riders - you can use the MTRA Office address as your destination on any travel papers since there are no addresses at the Trail Camps.
2. Don't forget to get your Recreation Passports for your vehicle license plates so that you can be "legal" on our rides. This issue is even more important since we have been given permission to use the DNR boat launch next to the Lake Huron access point and they will be checking those passports. Out-of-state members can purchase the Recreation Passport here or at any state campground – even at the boat launch:

3. The Michigan Shore-to-Shore Riding and Hiking Trail has been "created" on the **www.everytrail.com** website. Come on down and check us out. You'll find the trail and the "rig routes" listed with key words MTRA and Shore-to-Shore Trail. The trail sections that are finished have pictures. You do not need to have an account to access these files.
4. The Shore-to-Shore Trail is also listed on **www.opentrail.us** which is a new website designed specifically for horseback riders. You can find us in the Michigan section.
5. Plan to bring your horses to the Work Bees to enjoy the trails around the camps. We can't work ALL the time and the area around Garey Lake is spectacular!!
6. Just to clarify – after you register and pay for a ride, you can **cancel** 24 hours prior to the beginning of the ride to receive a "cancellation check". In order to receive a **refund** after the ride has begun, you must make a formal request to the Board of Directors which will be addressed at their next regularly scheduled meeting. Questions??? – call the MTRA Office!!
7. The Salsa Lady will be available for the September Ride during the following dates: September 4-10 and 19-25. She has a wonderful selection of food along the trail and dinners will be available.
8. Since the potluck dinners were such a roaring success on all the trophy rides in 2013 and June 2014, Joe Burrill has graciously volunteered to again sponsor the potluck dinners on Arrival Days prior to the first day's ride on all trophy rides. Don't forget to bring a dish to pass and your own table service and drink.
9. The Board of Directors has approved the option to earn one ride day per one Work Bee day to become policy. This policy originated in 2011 and will continue inclusive of the past two years. In order to earn "Credit" for days worked, you must sign-in at a **regularly scheduled MTRA Work Bee** and work all day. Call the MTRA Office if you have questions.
10. If you would like to receive the "approved" minutes from the Board of Director Meetings, please contact the MTRA Office and they will be sent "free" via email to any members' email address. If you would like them via US mail, please submit \$5.00 to cover printing and mailing costs for the year.
11. Don't forget those **Coggins** tests for this summer's rides. Coggins tests are "current" for a full year after the date the blood is drawn and tested so be sure that your Coggins tests are "up to date" before the rides on which you plan to participate. These tests, along with "travel papers" or health certificates are also required of all out-of-state horses. Bring these "papers" with you when you check in with the Trail Boss on the rides.
12. Just a reminder – the MTRA does **NOT** share, sell or in any way distribute email addresses or phone numbers with anyone!! If someone contacts the MTRA office for information about a member, we contact that particular member and have them make contact with the inquirer. Our goal is to protect the privacy of our members!!
13. Just to clarify – **Cancellations** of rides must occur prior to the beginning of the ride (2-3 days preferably) to be able to receive a check. **Refunds** must be applied for and addressed by the Board of Directors. All ride days canceled after the beginning of the ride will be only considered for refund and must be approved or denied by the Board.
14. If you have any questions and/or concerns about your membership, the association, the workings of the MTRA Office or anything regarding the rides, etc., please do not hesitate to call or email the office. We'll do our best to help you.

Special notice to September Ride participants - - -

It will be possible for the "East-West" trophy winners to ride all the way to Lake Michigan on Sunday, Sept. 14. They will receive their trophies on that day or they can wait until Monday, Sept. 15 and ride to/from the lake and finish the ride then. The cost of the ride will be the same – 11 days = \$110 per person. The Double-Crossers may also ride to Lake Michigan and back to Garey Lake on Sunday and then use Monday as a layover day. For details and specifics, please talk to the Trail Boss and attend nightly pre-ride meetings!!!

Bus questions... and answers...

With the replacement of Big Blue comes many rumors. To squelch the rumors, we would like to share the following information. Big Blue is a 1987 Chevrolet bus with a gas engine and has served us very well since 1998 when it was purchased by the MTRA. However, reliability is the operative factor, and we have come to realize that it was time for an upgrade. Therefore, the Board of Directors approved purchase of a 2003 Thomas bus from the L'Anse Creuse School District with 100,000 miles on it. It has a Cummins diesel engine, a Freightliner chassis and is a 71 passenger with one more row of seats than the old bus. This raises the number of MTRA bus riders to 48 rather than the previous 44 per run. It is being painted and prepared for service as we read these words and will be ready for the August Family Ride for its maiden voyage into the history of MTRA. We'll post lots of pictures of Bigger Blue on the www.mtra.org website and Facebook as soon as we can. What's going to happen to Big Blue? She will be auctioned on e-bay. Camp Improvements in our Future????

At a recent meeting of the Equine Trailways Subcommittee (ETS) on July 14th, it was proposed to do all kinds of improvements to the equine affiliated campgrounds and trails using grant money from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund (MNRTF) -11-133 which is part of the Statewide Equestrian Initiative. Four of the Trail Camps that are associated with the Michigan Shore-to-Shore Riding and Hiking Trail which are mentioned are: Elk Hill, Stoney Creek, 4-Mile and Hopkins Creek. Suggestions were made beginning with more picket poles to new vault toilets to picnic tables and fire rings. A suggestion for the Pigeon River Water access at Elk Hill would be to repair the slope to make the river more accessible and possibly open it up to the MTRA rides. More information will be forthcoming as projects get under way. These funds must be expended by August 1, 2015 so there is lots of work to do!!!
